Iconic Sam Houston Tour Boat Celebrates 67th Birthday & Prepares to Sail into Official Retirement in 2026

Port Houston to Honor Milestone with Story-Telling Campaign from Houston Residents

HOUSTON – Cue the confetti and ready the goodbyes: it's time to celebrate the 67th birthday—and the upcoming retirement—of Port Houston's beloved floating ambassador, the M/V Sam Houston! Since her maiden voyage on July 30, 1958, the Sam Houston has been more than a tour boat; she's a living symbol of Houston's maritime heritage. Now, as she prepares to sail into retirement, Port Houston is commemorating her legendary service with a public story-telling campaign honoring the moments and memories that made her iconic.

Over the decades, Port Houston has welcomed more than two million passengers aboard the tour vessel—from out-of-towners and local students to royalty, celebrities, political leaders, and astronauts—all eager to experience the pride and backbone of Houston, the Houston Ship Channel.

"The Sam Houston is more than just a boat; she's a symbol of Port Houston's legacy, hospitality and connection to the community," said Charlie Jenkins, CEO of Port Houston. "For 67 years, she's offered a front-row seat to the heart of maritime operations, helping guests understand the vital role our port plays in regional prosperity and global trade. As we celebrate her final season, we also reflect on the impact she's made and the stories that will live on well after her last voyage."

Port Houston recently announced plans to build a new tour vessel to expand its maritime education outreach, better serve guests with restricted mobility and reinforce the port's commitment to environmental sustainability and carbon neutrality. The new vessel is estimated to set sail on her maiden voyage in 12-14 months.

At 95 feet long and with a capacity of 100 passengers, the Sam Houston has been the site of some inspiring and uplifting stories over the last half-century. She's provided families with a rewarding daytime activity and also played Cupid more than once, sparking love stories that began on her decks and sailed into happily ever after.
